<b>Class name:</b>	Quilt as You Go Log Cabin
<b>Description:</b>	<p>This quilt can be created from a Jelly Roll with 42 strips or fabric you cut into 2½" strips. Each block is constructed independently in a "stitch and flip" process, which means you are quilting it as you are piecing it!</p> <p>This basic Quilt as You Go technique can be used in many of your future quilt projects in many other block designs. We will work on 3-4 blocks and learn and assemble with Nancy's Easy Sashing QAYG technique.</p>

## SUPPLY LIST

### FABRICS:

- Jelly Roll that has at least 42 strips. For larger quilt you would need 2 or more of the same Jelly Roll. Or choose your own fabrics, cut into 2 1/2" strips.
- Fabric for sashings for the front of the quilt, 1 yard. Fabric for the sashings of the back of the quilt, 1 yard
- Four backing squares cut 17" square – I recommend a small busy print that is not directional in design.*
- Cotton batting squares cut 17" square

### SUPPLIES:

- Optional books will be available for purchase from the teacher after class.*
- Heat Press Batting Together 3/4' wide – the teacher will bring to class for purchase if you are unable to find it at your local quilt shop.**
- Rotary cutter, 45mm
- Rotary mat – 18" x 24" size
- Ruler – 6"x24"
- Seam Ripper, Straight pins
- Thread to match your fabric chooses – I recommend a 50-weight cotton. You will need a thread that matches your backing squares and thread to match your Eash Sashings fabric.
- Spray Baste – the 505 brand
- Sharp scissors and a pair of small thread snips
- Fabric marking instrument that you can see on your chosen fabrics.
- Roxanne's Glue Baste-it
