



## Hydrangea Mosaic: Mosaic Quilt Making

### Supply List

**Skill Level:** Beginner/Intermediate

**Finished Size:** 14" x 12.5"

**Design Details:** Hydrangea Mosaic Quilt

Bring the beauty of Mosaics to your Quilt making. Heidi will break down each step she takes to create a mosaic quilt including working from a photograph, how to draw shapes, recognizing values in photos and translating them to the correct colors, and how to choose just the right fabrics. She'll share traditional and innovative design and cutting techniques plus she'll show you how to do her original technique of putting the mosaic design together without the need for a light box, stencils or fabric marking tools. To finish the project, you will layer the quilt, do some easy free-motion quilting. Binding, batting and Heidi's tips for successfully finishing your pretty wall quilt will be included with the kit.

**Kit Includes:** Color placement guide, Template, Foundation materials, Pre-cut & Pre-fused batik fabric pieces, Top Thread, Batting, Backing and binding fabrics.

**Teacher Supplies:** Press cloths, Quilt spray and/or Adhesive, Water for spritzing/steaming, Station/Table set up with Quilt Cutting mats, Rotary Cutters and Rulers and any additional required handouts necessary.

**Facility Provides:** Sewing machines & accessories, Irons & Iron boards

**Required Supplies:** *Please bring the following items to class.*

- Fabric scissors
- Small sharp fine-tip scissors or embroidery snips (Karen K. Buckley Perfect Curved Red or Perfect Seafoam scissor recommended)
- Precision Tip Tweezers (I sell these in my shop at [www.HeidiProffetty.com/shop](http://www.HeidiProffetty.com/shop))
- Elmer's washable glue stick
- Small roll of 1" Blue Painters Tape
- Quilting gloves, if desired
- Free-Motion quilting slider mat, if desired
- Notebook, pen/pencil for notetaking
- Small paper trash bag

**Note:** This is a small and detailed quilt design. We will be doing a lot of precision placement of small fabric pieces therefore it is important to have a pair of precision or fine tip tweezers. It is also important to have a pair of sharp fine tip scissors for trimming threads throughout the quilting of the project. Bring your glasses if necessary.
