## Star Baby Supply List:

Star Baby pattern $\$ 23.50$ (includes all foundation papers, template layout sheets and directions).

- (Houston class participants receive a $15 \%$ discount and free U.S. first class mail shipping.) Available through my Etsy shop here: https://indigobluequilts.etsy.com?coupon=HOUSTON2024
- Two - One Gallon size Ziploc style plastic bags to organize your papers and fabrics.
- Box of Jumbo trombone style paper clips (regular paper clips, just bigger. Available at Staples, Office Depot, any office supply. Not the giant paper clips, these are about 2".
- Repositionable Glue Stick (You can get them anywhere - Staples, Office Depot, Joann's, Michaels)
- Fabric glue pen (optional, but very useful!) Fon's and Porter or Sewline recommended.
- Template Plastic ( $3^{\prime \prime}$ by 12 " piece) for fold template. Cardstock can also be used.


## General Sewing Supplies:

- 12" Add-a-quarter ruler (Optional, but highly recommended)
- 6" x 12" ruler
- Medium size cutting mat (18" x 24")
- Rotary cutter
- Coordinating Thread
- Flower head pins (recommended) or pins of your choice
- Scissors
- Seam Ripper


## Fabrics:

- Nine 2.5 " strips of fabric. That's right! Only nine strips of fabric! See note on next page about selecting the strips.
- Background fabric - $3 / 4$ yards (The light pastel green fabric is the background fabric in the pattern picture.)

Please have your papers and fabrics cut out before class. Instructions are included in the pattern, and a video is included on my website: www.indigobluequilts.com. We will not have time to help you cut out papers in class, so please reach out if you need help.

Want to make it bigger? Check out The Goodnight Star

You will love that the hardest thing about this pattern is how to arrange the lone star. You will need nine strips of fabrics regardless of how you arrange them. In this sample, nine different colors were used, one for each position on the diamond. The values are similar, so it may not be obvious that different fabrics are used in each position of the diamond.


Four different colors were used here:


On Page 11 of your pattern, there is a diagram that shows the placement of the colors. In the Blue sample above, the dark blue is S 9 , the medium blue is S 6 and S 8 , the next lighter blue is $\mathrm{S} 3, \mathrm{~S} 5$, and S 7 , and light blue is S 2 and S 4 , and the dark blue is S 1 .

You can also use pencils or crayons to play around with your colors, or sign up for Quiltster. It's an online fabric auditioning tool, and it costs only $\$ 9.99$ a month. It's super easy and intuitive: Quiltster: Quilt Planning Made Easy | Quiltster
