

The Art of Kyo-Kanoko Shibori Process Sandra Lee Chandler

Kanoko shibori is the closest to what you may know as tie-dye. The cloth kumo shibori is a technique similar to the tie-dye you might be familiar with. To create the pattern, the cloth is folded or pleated, and then bound with thread or rubber bands. This method is particularly effective for making circular shapes. On the other hand, Kumo shibori involves wrapping the cloth around objects and binding them into finger-like shapes.s pleated or folded and bound with thread or rubber bands to achieve the patterning. This is a good method for creating circular shapes. Kumo shibori involves wrapping cloth, sometimes around objects, into finger-like bindings.
