

Selvage HST Sampler with Tina Craig

Learn how to incorporate selvages in the ultimate scrap quilt project. We will make super-versatile half-square-triangle units that can be arranged in a myriad of ways.

Fabric requirements are given for the 4-block table topper shown, which finishes at 21" square.

Supply List

Selvage strips: A quart-sized baggie full will get you off to a good start. Strips of all lengths are useful. Be on the look out for interesting color dots and text. When I trim off a selvage edge from yardage, I keep at least 1/2" of the printed fabric beyond the white selvage.

Foundation: Muslin or lightweight interfacing. Whichever you choose, please cut (16) 4.5" squares before class. (I prefer muslin.)

Solid Accent Fabric: The selvages show up well against solids or fabrics that read as solids. Almost any color will look great.

Cut (2) 5" squares from 4 different colors (as illustrated in sample above) or (8) squares of one color.

Later, you will need (3) 2" strips for sashing and outer border and (2) 2.25" strips for binding.

Also...

Piecing thread of your choice in white or off-white

Sharp fabric scissors

Small cutting mat and rotary cutter with sharp blade

Cutting rulers: 6" square and 6" X 12"



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
